# Monitoring

### Interbank claims roll-over

by host central bank/supervisor

## Cross-border lending

by home central bank/supervisor

### Loan losses

jointly by home and host supervisors



# Liquidity

### Parent bank commitments

- Country by country
- How to prevent beggar-thy-neighbor?
- Limited eligible collateral

## Home support measures

Non-discriminatory

Avoid liquidity hoarding



# Liquidity

# Local currency liquidity

- Widening eligible collateral
  - Quasi-fiscal risk
- Lower reserve requirements

## Role of IFIs' support

- How much roll-over needed for credibility?
- How large a buffer is needed?

- Comparable methodology

- IMF and hosts do top down
- EBRD and home do bank by bank

## How much capital needed?

- Recognize current losses up front
- Build buffers
  - Stress testing
- How much for groups, how much for subsidiaries?



## Capital needs

### Who provides?

- Parent groups
- Home authorities
- Host authorities
  - Local banks
  - Banks of systemic importance to host

### **Conditions**

- How coercive?
- Government representation
  - Role of hosts
- Losses for shareholders
- Governance
- Form of capital
- Exit strategy
